Management Team Notes

- The Preliminary Audit was held last week. No news is good news.
- Both Police and Fire Departments have had a large number of calls the past two weeks. Kudos to all for managing them well.
- The City will be closing on the 1292 Frontage Road property for the central Water Treatment Plant in April. The tenants have been given 90 day notice to vacate. Part of the process for acquiring the property requires the City to assist in relocation for the existing businesses, Stacy's Stars and Carbones.
- There was an Open House for residents near the central water treatment plant and water line project this past Tuesday to address questions. The project will begin this summer.
- Signage is being added to the 10 mile loop.
- Pool repairs will be done in April; pool to be filled mid-May.
- The Police Department has all vehicles in for 2025—yes, something to celebrate. Vehicle acquisition has been difficult over the past few years!
- The officer position has been posted; internally there are two applicants for the School Resource Officer position recently approved by the District.
- The Salt Shed at Public Works is getting a new roof next week.
- The summer programming schedule will be released next week.

City Council Updates

March 17, 2025 Meeting

- Council welcomed new employees Anna Henn, Lucas Knoll, and Charlotte King.
- Amended the city's legal agreement with LeVander, Gillen & Miller, P.A to modify the responsible attorney. Greta Bjerkness, shareholder and vice president at the firm, will serve as the city's attorney. Watch for a later article about Greta's appointment.
- Authorized the city's entry into a Municipal Cooperative Construction Agreement with MnDOT for the Highway 55 Signal Replacements Project. The cost share for the city to complete this project is currently estimated to be \$616,305.15.
- Accepted a \$100 donation from Tina Foster in Memory of Earl Foster to the Fire Department.
- Accepted a \$600 donation from Allen and Kathy Plaisted and a \$500 donation from Miesville Lions Club to the Fire Department.
- Accepted a \$1,000 donation from The Hastings Youth Athletic Association (HYAA) to the Parks and Recreation Department to be used for a memorial bench in a city park or on a city trail.
- Approved the designation of the Run for the Roses 5k & Family Day as a Special Event on May 3, 2025.
