Kudos to all staff who had to continue working in the extreme heat over the past few weeks. We appreciate your commitment to working through the toughest of conditions.




Management Team Meeting Highlights

- Public Works continues skimpatching with the new-to-the-city paver. The paver has given the team much more flexibility to do the work around weather and other events while extending the life of streets in the city.
- Bids are due September 5 for the Three Rivers trail project on the south end of the city. On behalf of the south end of the city looking forward to project completion!
- A joint power agreement has been signed with the Dept of Natural Resources to repair the boat launch. The city will oversee the project.
- The Family Aquatic Center has wrapped up another season and is hosting lifeguard training this week.
- The senior project, Vermillion Acres, on Co Rd 47 should see more activity in the near future, wrapping up in late spring 2025.
- Parks is meeting with the Lake Isabel park project contractor to review the remaining schedule for completion.
- The Lake Rebecca project design and construction will be in two phases (natural

resources and development) and will go out for bidding soon.

- Public Works has regular meetings with MnDOT on the Hwy 61 reconstruction project. It is slated to begin in 2027.
- The water treatment plant siting study will be presented to the Council on 9/3/24 for plants 2 and 3.
- The Industrial Park water tower reconditioning project is in the plans and specs phase for work to begin in 2025.
