


It's Diaper Time Again

Hot Topics

Possible New Police Station and City Hall:

- * Representatives from WOLD, the architectural firm working on the project, have been meeting with each department to fine tune their needs.
- Surveys are being collected from city residents.
- ❖ The project is on schedule to bring each part to the city council with the final approval being requested at the December 11 meeting.
- ❖ If approved, demolition of the pool will begin in January or February.

Talkin' Trash:

- ❖ A listening session regarding organized trash collection was held on August 7 with an overflow crowd in attendance.
- Surveys are being collected from city residents.
- City council will continue the discussion at the September work session.

New City Website:

The website committee has been meeting to develop a brand new website for the city. The site is scheduled to be completed later this year.

2018 Budget:

❖ The city manager and AEM have reviewed the proposed 2018 budget thoroughly and will present it to council on September 11 to establish a public hearing and on December 11 for adoption.

Alatus Apartments Project

❖ Alatus Apartments, being constructed next to the city golf course, are progressing according to plan. Driving of pilings has started; footings and foundations will follow. Both segments are expected to take about two months to complete.

Mayor Hemken Sends Thanks


Mayor **Kathi Hemken** sent a handwritten thank you note for all who donated children's books for her Farmers Market 'books for kids' effort.


This is another feather in the New Hope cap as the Holiday Train does not automatically stop at the same cities each year.


