What is HEDRA?

The Hastings Economic Development and Redevelopment Authority (HEDRA) promotes and fosters economic development and redevelopment activities within the City. HEDRA purchases blighted buildings and under-utilized sites for redevelopment. The transformation of the former Hudson Manufacturing building into the Confluence Hotel would not have been completed without HEDRA's purchase of the property and access to grants for site cleanup. HEDRA also sells land within the Hastings Industrial Park for new development and has grants and business assistance programs for business development. The board consists of five citizen members and two City Council members. Regular meetings occur on the 2nd Thursday of the month at 6:00 pm in the Council Chambers.
