

Take the flu from wild to mild.



Flu season is coming up. With both the flu and COVID-19 spreading in the fall and winter, getting your vaccinations will be more important than ever.

Who should get vaccinated?

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends that everyone six months and older should receive the updated 2024-2025 COVID-19 and flu vaccines. These vaccines are safe to receive at the same time. There are different vaccines approved for different age groups. It's especially important that certain people get vaccinated either because they are at high risk of having serious flu-related complications, or because they live with or care for people who are at high risk for developing flu-related complications. If you have questions about whether or not you should get a flu or COVID-19 vaccine, consult your healthcare provider.

Where to get the vaccines?

Flu shots will be available at a variety of locations statewide through Blue Cross® Blue Shield® of Arizona (AZ Blue) providers such as:



AZ Blue in-network providers

See your regular doctor or primary care provider to get your flu or COVID-19 shot. Don't have a regular doctor? Register or log in to your MyBlueSM account at azblue.com. There you can search for providers in your network. Make sure to check that they are offering the vaccine when you make your appointment.
