Management Team Notes

- The Food Drive with the Sheriff's Office begins April 21.
- Officer Gorney participated in the Pinewood Derby.
- 2 applicants for Special Use Permits for Retail Cannabis establishments.
- The City closed on 1292 N. Frontage Road (aka Carbone's) and the businesses will have until the end of June to vacate. The City is working with them to relocate. The design work is nearly complete and building of the water treatment plant will begin later this year.
- There was a water main break behind O'Reilly Auto Parts early this week. Fixed!
- There will be some striping in the downtown area and the Arena parking lot on April 29.
- Mn DOT is closing Hwy 316 from 200th south to Hwy 61 starting April 28 through early June.
- Nearly 600 swim lesson registrants so far! Work continues on the pool to get it ready for the summer season.
- The switch over to the new refrigerant system at the Arena will take place on April 28.
- Fire Department has been doing live burn trainings the past few weeks.
- Hastings High School is recognizing the Fire Department this week for being "friends of educators."
- A 10% increase in water rates has been proposed to Council. The 2nd Reading will be May 5. The increase would be effective July 1, 2025.
- Audit work continues as preparation for 2026 budgeting begins.
- Arbor Day and the opening of Isabel Park was celebrated on April 18 with the planting of trees in the park.
- Preparation for the Industrial Park Water Tower reconditioning began last week with flushing of main lines.

- Bid opening for the sewer lining program was this week.
- The Met Council has determined that a new wastewater treatment plant will not be built in Hastings, but rather wastewater will be piped west to Empire.
- Police Week Open House is May 13 from 5-7 pm outside the Police Station.
- Council met with the School Board in a workshop preceding the Council Meeting on Monday, April 21. Topics included existing joint projects as well as future opportunities to collaborate for the community.
- The Employee Engagement Survey will launch on May 5.
- A ribbon-cutting ceremony for the Vermillion River Greenway is slated for early May.
- Presentation by MnDOT staff on the Hwy 61 project at Council. Some construction is anticipated to start in 2027, but the bulk of it will start in 2028. Keep up with the project at the <u>MnDOT project page</u>.
- Presentation on Housing Study to Council—Dakota County Community Development Agency (CDA) contracted for a county-wide housing study, as well as some cities like Hastings. <u>Read the study report</u>.

City Council Updates

April 21, 2025 Meeting

- Accepted a quote and awarded a contract to HCM Architects to rebuild the Lions Park shelter that was severely damaged by fire last fall.
- Accepted 1st Quarter 2025 Strategic Plan Report.
- Accepted a \$7,981 donation from the Side-by-Side ride to the Fire Department.
- Approved the designation of the 2025 Gobble Gait as a special event to be held on Nov. 27.
- Approved the designation of the Historic Car Show as a special event to be held on the 3rd Sunday of each month, May through October.
- Appointed John Moes to the Planning Commission.
- Withdrew membership from Red Rock Corridor and Great River Trail Commissions.
- Approved first reading and ordinance amendment for electric-assisted vehicles and speed limit for Hastings Trails.
