A collector from Minnesota Occupational Health On-Site services will arrive at the identified location within 90 minutes or less of the requesting call. Calling prior to the transport of an injured employee (to a clinic or hospital) will help with any wait time for a collector to arrive.

NOTE: MOH onsite collections require that an employer representative be present throughout the entire collection for a Reasonable Suspicion test.
