Spotlight on Safety and Wellness

By Dawn Skelly There are some exciting updates happening at City Hall and other city buildings, focused on enhancing safety and wellness.



The city's Safety Committee recently approved the purchase of new Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) for both City Hall and the LeDuc Mansion. These new devices replace older models that were no longer effective and introduce advanced technology to support life-saving efforts. The upgraded AEDs feature both visual and spoken instructions, providing clear, step-by-step guidance during an emergency. Additionally, the new units are equipped with pads that real-time feedback on chest compressions, including whether too much or too little pressure is being applied. The AEDs also come with a kit containing scissors, gloves, alcohol wipes, and a face shield. The pads can connect directly to Fire/EMS department monitors, enabling first responders to see how long CPR has been performed and how many compressions have been given. Plus, with the simple press of a button, the machines can be switched to pediatric mode for younger patients. These AEDs were purchased through a partnership with Allina Heart Safe Communities, and by 2027, all city buildings will be equipped with new or updated AEDs. A big thank you to the Safety Committee for purchasing the equipment, Al Storlie for servicing the AEDs, and Joe Cysiewski for conducting staff training on their use.

In addition, City Hall now offers a new wellness room designed to provide a peaceful retreat for employees. This comfortable space includes a cozy chair for lactating mothers or anyone looking for a quiet place to relax or make a phone call. The room features a soothing sound machine, potted plants, a whiteboard with words of affirmation, and a handmade blanket, creating a welcoming atmosphere for those in need of a break. Megan Schlei thoughtfully curated the space, even taking her

husband along to help select a chair that would be comfortable for people of various heights. The chair rocks and reclines, and with the calming sounds from the sound machine, it feels like an escape. "Everyone needs a little clock-out time," Megan said. She also generously donated her personally crocheted blanket, while the tables and lamps were donated by others. The Police Department also has a wellness room, and other departments are working on creating similar spaces. Be sure to stop by the new wellness room at City Hall, located upstairs across from Charlie Judge's office in the old courthouse, which was once used as a storage area for the Pioneer Room.
