#### Police Station & City Hall Construction Update

On the city hall side, the hanging/finishing of gypsum was recently completed along with mudding/taping/sanding. Interior painting is nearing completion and will be followed by installation of the ceiling grid. On the police station side, installation of HVAC ducting along with mudding/taping/ sanding will continue, followed by the start of interior painting. On the exterior, metal coping and wall panel installation continues.

The bid opening for city hall, theater, park shelter building and hockey rink demolition was held on Feb. 7 and the bids were discussed at the Feb. 19 council work session. The low bid was about \$11,000 less than the engineers estimate/ budget and staff will be recommending awarding the

contract at a March council meeting. Demolition of the theater, park shelter and rink will start later this winter/early spring, with city hall demolition to take place after the move into the new building.

Meetings were conducted with employees from each department to give them the opportunity to see plans for office/ cubicle furniture and work space areas in the new building, and to give input on options for their specific spaces. Staff also had a chance to tour the building to get a sense of the new space.

#### Park/Pool Planning Update

The park amenities, parking lot and landscaping pre-bid meeting was held on Jan. 31. The bid opening was held on Feb. 14. The bid openings for the skate park and pool will be held the first part of March. All bids will be reviewed at the March work session, with potential contract awards at the Mar. 25 council meeting. The bid schedule has been arranged so that all costs for the pool and other Civic Center Park improvements will be known before the demolition bid is accepted.
