


# **Employee Spotlights**


#### Ricky Plemel, Golf Superintendent

She and her counterpart, who is based out of Crystal, will work with minority communities in New Hope, Crystal and Robbinsdale. In Christina's words, the JCPP has been developed to "build bridges between police and community." She accepted this role to "be a part of the change that she has faith can and will come" through community engagement and in partnership with police department staff. She holds to the tenant that perception is nonnegotiable. Over the next few weeks, she will be riding along with officers on patrol and working to establish a multicultural advisory committee.

A little about Christina personally. She has a Bachelor of Arts in Criminal Justice with an emphasis in Restorative Justice from Metro State University. She started her career working at Hennepin County Adult Detention Center and RS Eden WatchGuard working with inmate programs. Christina then went on to manage affordable housing properties and programs for the past 20 years. Specifically, over the past eight years



she worked at the City of Plymouth as an HRA Specialist with the Housing Choice Voucher Program and the program housing inspector. She recently married and together their blended family includes six children, two grandchildren and one more grandchild on the way. Christina is an AVID Vikings fan and in her spare time, she loves to spend time with her family, travel and attend her children's basketball games.

# **Happenings**

## **GreenStep Coordinator Recognized**

Congrats to Jeff Alger, community development specialist, for being selected for GreenStep's Coordinator Spotlight in their most recent newsletter. The following is excerpted/edited from the text, including a bit about Jeff and what the City has accomplished under his leadership.



"New Hope ... joined the GreenStep Cities program in 2015. As

the city's GreenStep Coordinator, Jeff advanced the city to Step 3 in just one year and has been busy implementing and reporting actions ever since then! Jeff has a B.A. in Business Administration and Management from Augsburg University and a Master's in Urban & Regional Studies and a Graduate Certificate in Local Government Management from Minnesota State University, Mankato. Jeff interned with GreenStep partner, Rethos, before starting at New Hope.

Jeff is proud of the City's accomplishments related to sustainability, including:

- The completion of 94 GreenStep Cities best practice actions, the third most of the 146 participating cities.
- New Hope received the 2017 LMC Sustainable City Award for the Northwood Park stormwater improvement project, which included rain gardens, a stormwater pond, and a 160,000-gallon underground water reuse system and stormwater treatment structure.
- The city's new police station/city hall was constructed in 2019 using Section 179D Energy-Efficient Commercial Building Tax Deduction program, which will save approximately \$50,932 in energy costs annually.
- Jeff has played a large role in developing Safe Routes to School plans for the elementary schools in New Hope. The City recently completed a demonstration pilot program at Meadow Lake Elementary and received a grant for infrastructure improvements that will encourage walking and improve safety for students and pedestrians.
- New Hope is home to one of the most unique and sustainable car washes in the
  country. The Holiday Station store car wash located at 7201 Bass Lake Road
  utilizes a stormwater collection system that retains all rainwater onsite and
  reuses it for the car wash. A filtration system recycles and reuses the water that
  is used by the car wash. It is the first known car wash in the country to utilize
  such technology."

## Biometric Screening - March 28-30
